



SMOKEFREE AIR ACT

Vehicles

Overview

The Smokefree Air Act prohibits smoking in nearly all vehicles owned, leased, or provided by an employer.

Prohibitions & Other Provisions

Smoking is prohibited in:

- Vehicles provided by a private employer that are used by more than one person in the course of employment.
- Vehicles provided by a private employer that carry passengers during the course of employment.
- Privately-owned vehicles that constitute a place of employment or public place.
- All state and local government vehicles.

Vehicles Not Regulated

Smoking is not prohibited in:

- Limousines under private hire.
- Vehicles provided by a private employer that are for the sole use of that driver and are not used by more than one person in the course of employment either as a driver or passenger.
- Privately owned vehicles not otherwise defined as a place of employment or public place.
- Cabs of motor trucks or truck tractors if no nonsmoking employees are present.
- Farm tractors, farm trucks, and implements of husbandry when being used for their intended purposes.

Posting of Signs

- The Smokefree Air Act requires the posting of “no smoking” signs in all applicable vehicles to inform persons that they are entering a nonsmoking place.
- Signs must be posted in every vehicle described above where smoking is prohibited or that has been designated nonsmoking.
- Signs must be visible from the exterior of the vehicle.
- This requirement does not apply to unmarked or undercover vehicles used by law enforcement.
